

LHS Expectations for Student Participation in Co-Curricular Activities and Athletics

The age limit for all athletics is 'under 19 as of September 30th' of the current school year.

Students in all grades are welcome and encouraged to participation in athletics, clubs and committees.

A full-time student who is in good standing (attending class, punctual, working to potential, following rules, being respectful to others and school property) and passing all courses is eligible to participate in extra-curricular clubs, committees, activities and on our sports teams.

Students must recognize that their participation in co-curricular activities and/or athletics at LHS is a privilege which brings with it the obligations and responsibilities of being a good citizen and a strong representative of our school.

Student athletes who have been selected as a member of a school team are expected to commit to their team(s) for the entire season. Athletes who do not demonstrate a commitment to the team for the duration of the program may be removed from the team. A student athlete is expected to attend all practices, games, and meetings.

Students participating in extra-curricular and/or athletics are reminded that ALL school rules apply at ALL school sponsored activities. This includes meetings, games, special events, practices, tournaments etc. both at school and away from school. These students must be present in school during the day if they plan to participate in an extra-curricular activity, practice, or game after school unless an appropriate excuse has been provided and approved by the staff advisor or Athletic Director.

All student athletes must:

- Have passed in previously assigned books, uniforms, etc.
- Have paid athletic fees (if required)

Each student wishing to participate in a co-curricular activity must complete a co-curricular eligibility form for each co-curricular activity in which they wish to participate and to turn it into the coach or staff advisor, who in turn, will forward a copy to the athletic director. These forms can be found on Lockview website.

Any concerns brought forward by teachers, parents, or administration throughout the school year will be heard by the **LHS Co-Curricular/Athletic Council**. The Co-Curricular Council is composed of two teachers, the Athletic Director and a member of the school administration. The council may recommend to the administration any of the following actions after reviewing the concern:

- Student receives a verbal warning and progress is monitored.
- The student may be denied participation, either temporarily or permanently, on the school club, committee or team.
- Discipline, if warranted, using the Provincial Code of Conduct.

A student serving an in or out of school suspension will not be permitted to participate in any extra-curricular meetings, events, activities, practices or games during the suspension, beginning the moment of the infraction until the student is permitted to return to school. This includes a weekend should it fall in the middle of the suspension.

The administration has the right to extend the suspension or to declare the student ineligible to continue their participation on the club, committee and/or team depending on the severity of the situation and the number of previous suspensions.
